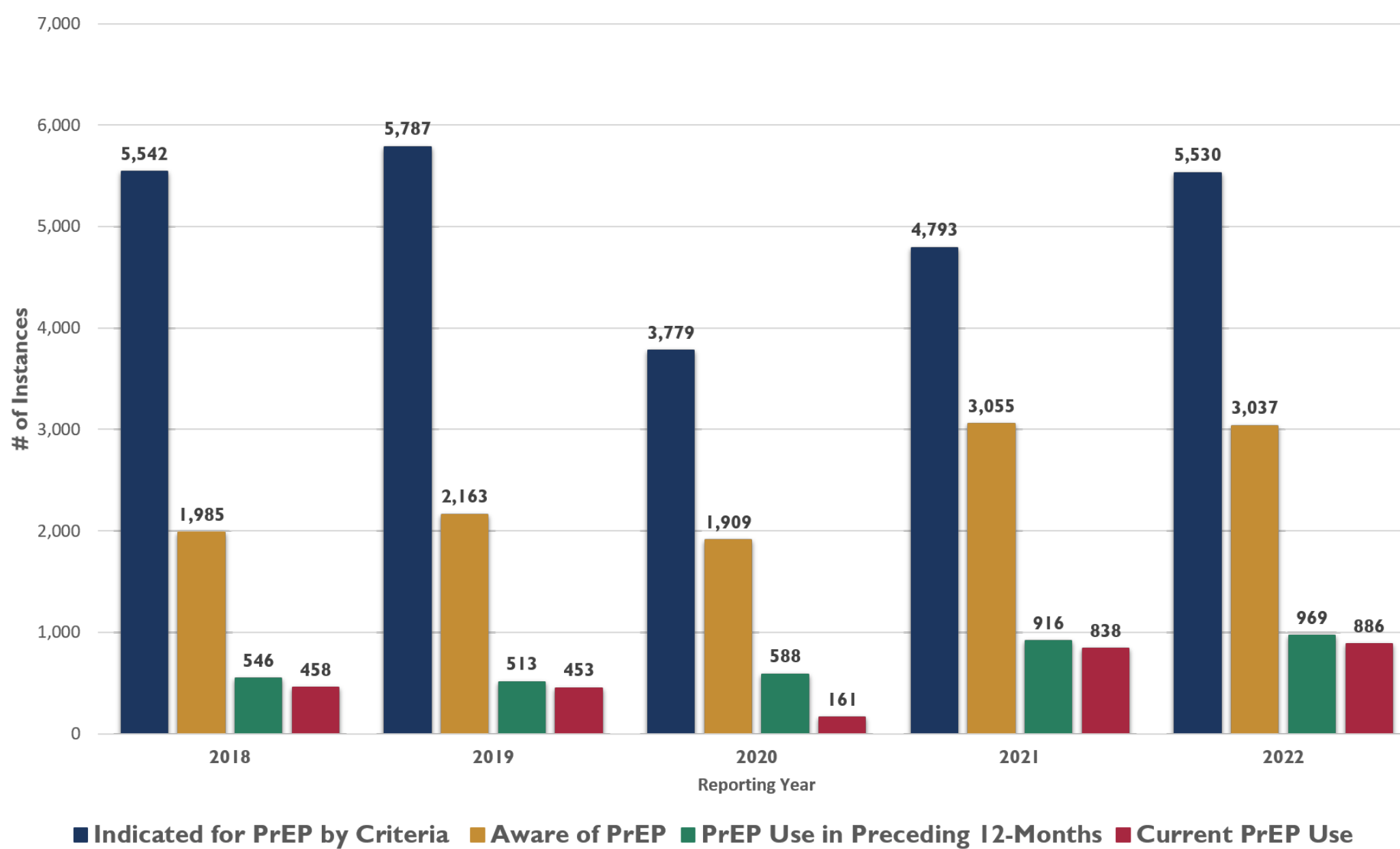


# HIV and Hepatitis Prevention Program Snapshot

## Integrated Testing Services PrEP Screening and Referral Services: 2022

**ITS PrEP Screening 2018 - 2022**

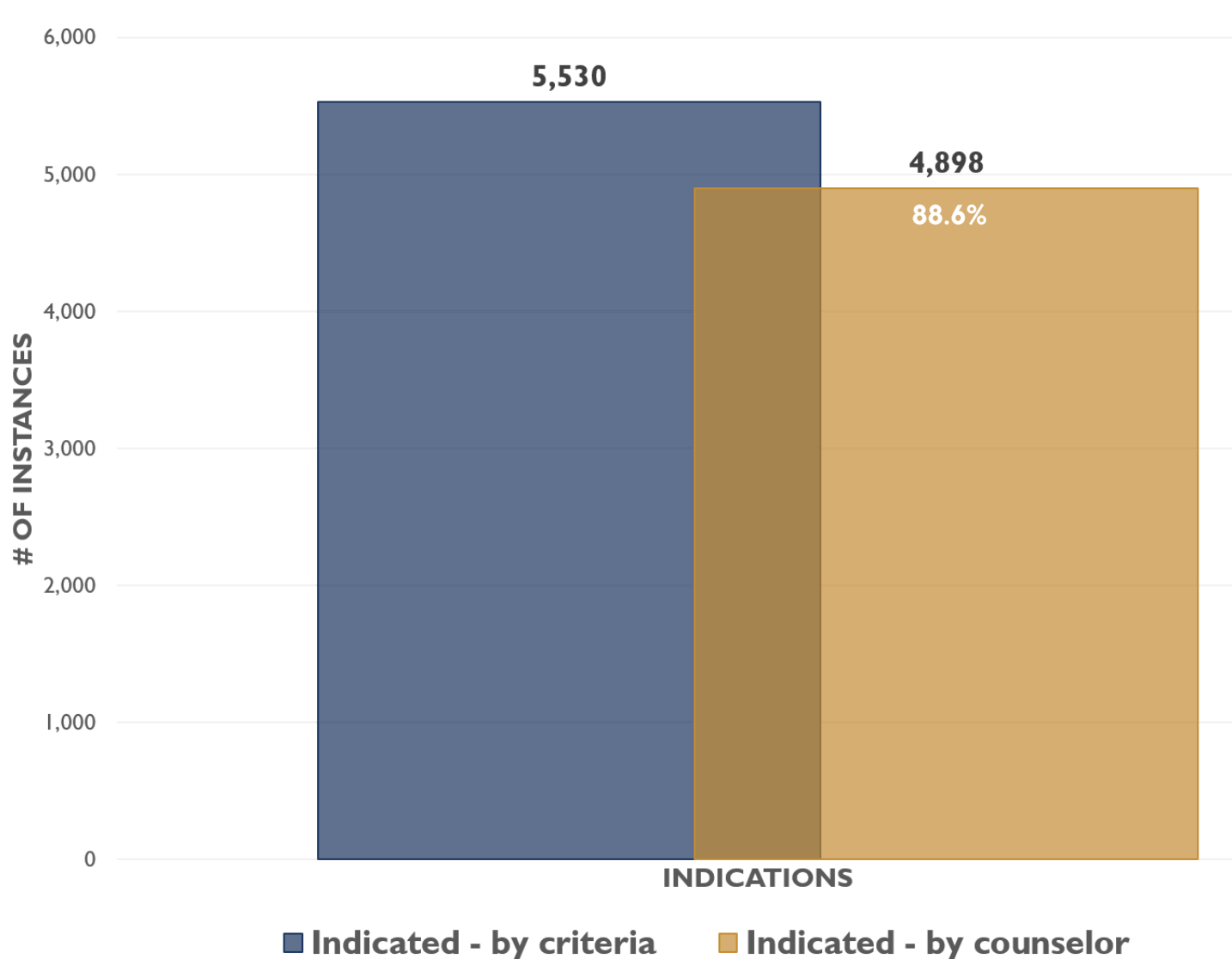
The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimate that **8,260 Iowans would benefit from Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) to prevent acquisition of HIV.**

Available data sources estimate that at least **1,925 Iowans had active prescriptions for PrEP medications in 2021.**

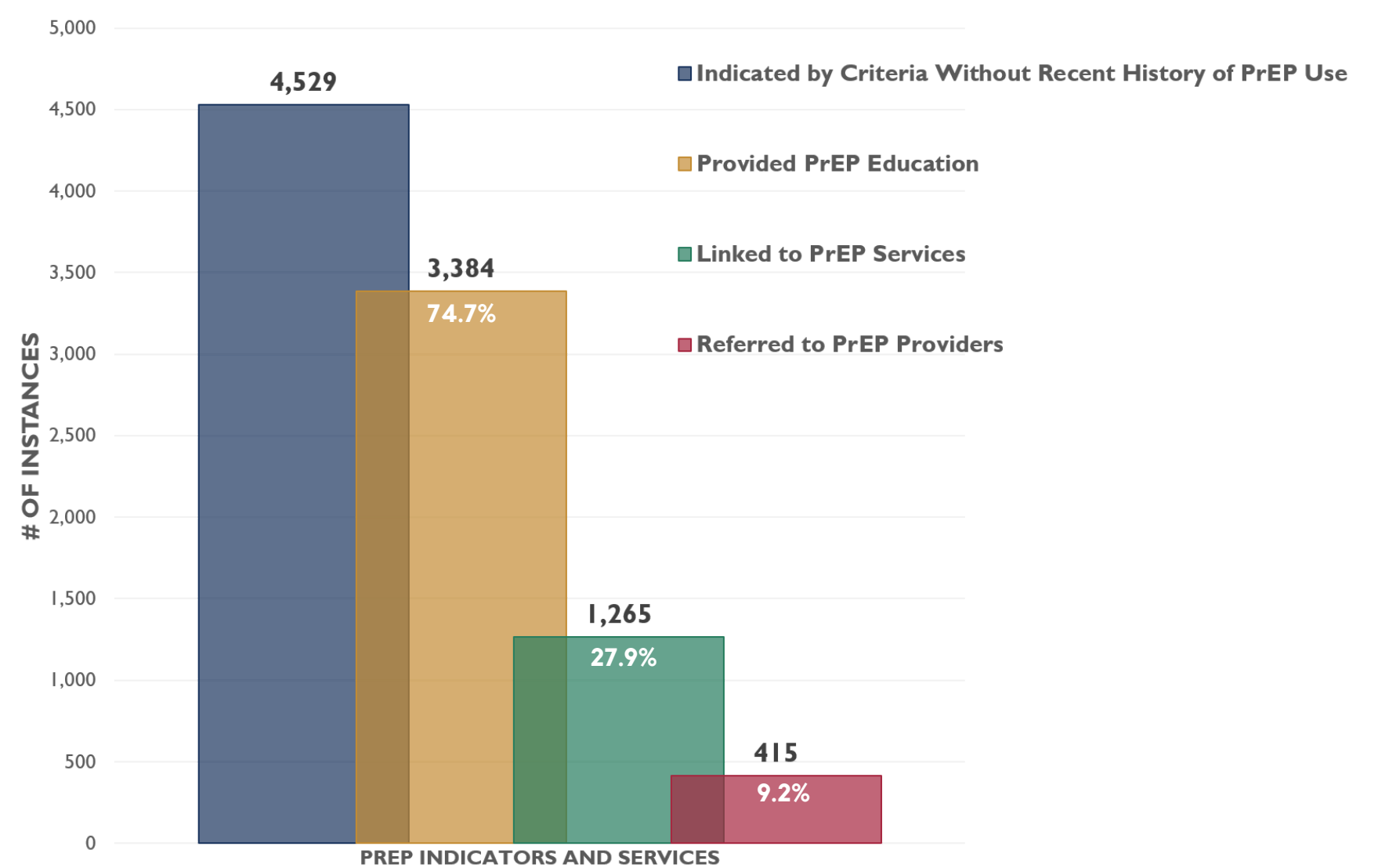
Of those who tested for HIV through Integrated Testing Services in 2022, 5,530 met the CDC classification to be indicated for PrEP by criteria.

- **54.9% of those indicated they had heard of PrEP** (compared 47.8% over the five-year period represented).
- **17.5% reported PrEP use in the preceding twelve-month period** (compared to 13.9% over the five-year period represented).
- **16% reported PrEP use as 'current' on the date of testing** (compared to 11% over the five-year period represented).

**PrEP Education, Linkage, Referral 2022**



Test counselors **appropriately identified 88.6% of people who were indicated for PrEP based on CDC criteria** (compared to 77.1% in 2021).

**Of those people indicated for PrEP by CDC criteria who reported no current or recent PrEP use (4,529), 74.7% received PrEP education as part of their testing encounter** (compared to 54.2% in 2021), **27.9% accepted linkage-to-care support** (compared to 30% in 2021), and **9.2% accepted a referral to a PrEP provider** (compared to 12.5% in 2021).
