HIV and Hepatitis Prevention Program Snapshot Program Supported HIV Screening: 2022


The HIV and Hepatitis Prevention Program partners with multiple stakeholders to support the strategic implementation of HIV testing services across lowa.

In 2022, 23,031 rapid and conventional HIV tests were administered in partnership with 73 agencies across seven major settings (an increase of 32.3% from 2021).

- 12 Integrated Testing Services

 Agencies providing clinical and prioritized outreach testing that are funded by lowa HHS to support the implementation of these activities. Each site provides services in a geographic region and dedicates a minimum of 1.0 full-time employee or equivalent to the project;
- 13 Federally Qualified Health
 Centers working to implement routine
 screening into primary care encounters in
 partnership with the lowa Primary Care
 Association;
- 22 Community-based Screening
 Services projects working with Iowa HHS
 and the Family Planning Council of Iowa to
 provide safety-net STI screening services;
- I Family Planning Clinic providing optout rapid HIV screening to clients accessing STI screening services;
- 14 Substance Use Treatment locations integrating HIV screening into medically assisted treatment programs for clients with opioid use disorder, including many clients who have a history of injection drug use;
- II Community-based Pharmacies
 providing free rapid testing in partnership
 with the lowa Pharmacy Association; and
- 10 State Disease Intervention
 Specialists providing free rapid and confirmatory HIV testing to individuals engaged in partner services.

Prevention Program Total HIV Testing and Positivity 2022



Across all projects, the program reported a 0.20% total positivity rate in 2022, down from 0.24% in 2021.

Iowa HHS partner services (provided by the 10 state Disease Intervention Specialists) had the highest positivity rate of any project reported at 3.03%. This can be attributed to the nature of Partner Services work, which involves active follow-up with individuals named as partners of or contacts to people who have been newly diagnosed with HIV and other reportable sexually transmitted infections including syphilis and gonorrhea.
